### VITAMIN A

233 micrograms of Vitamin A can be found in the children's vitamins. The important functions of Vitamin A include:

- · helping your immune system to work properly
- · helping vision in dim light
- · keeping skin and the lining of some parts of the body, such as the nose, healthy

Vitamin A supplements are not advised during pregnancy.



## **FOLIC ACID**

400 micrograms of Folic Acid can be found in the women's vitamins. It is important for women to take Folic Acid daily as part of preconception care; it is suggested to take this daily for 2-3 months prior to conception and during the first trimester as it can help to:

- · form healthy red blood cells
- · reduce the risk of birth defects called neural tube defects, such as spina bifida, in unborn babies



20 milligrams of Vitamin C can be found in the children's vitamins and is recommended for children aged 6 months to 5 years.

70 milligrams can be found in the women's. Vitamin C is important for:

- · helping to protect cells and keeping them healthy
- · maintaining healthy skin, blood vessels, bones and cartilage
- · helping with wound healing

A lack of Vitamin C may cause Scurvy.

Vitamin C can also be found in a variety of fruit and veg, which can be purchased with your Healhy Start card.

## VITAMIN D

The daily recommended amount of 10 micrograms of Vitamin D for pregnant and breastfeeding women can be found in the women's vitamins. The children's vitamins contain 10 micrograms of Vitamin D3, recommended daily from birth for breastfed babies. Vitamin D helps with the following:

- · regulation of calcium & phosphate
- keeping both teeth & muscles healthy

A lack of Vitamin D may cause Rickets (children) and bone pain (adults). Direct sunlight is a good source of Vitamin D.

## DIETARY REQUIREMENTS

- If an infant is having more than 500ml of formula milk per day, vitamin supplements are not recommended.
- The Healthy Start vitamins contain the exact amount of vitamins recommended by the Government to be taken as vitamin supplements.
- · The Healthy Start vitamins are vegetarian and Halal certified.
